Memorial Day

What Is Memorial Day?

Memorial Day is a unique national holiday in the United States, honoring those who have died in battle for our freedom and security. It's celebrated annually on the last Monday of May. It has become a day of remembrance for lost family members, friends, or comrades-in-arms who sacrificed their lives in service to their country. It's one of the few days of the year when flags must be flown at half-staff until noon as a reminder of the loss of those who have served their country.

When Is Memorial Day 2023?

It's held every year on the last Monday of May. Memorial Day 2023 will be held on Monday, May 29th. Why Do We Celebrate Memorial Day? **Memorial Day has roots in Decoration Day, which was first observed in 1868. It began as <u>an effort to honor</u> the fallen Union Soldiers from the Civil War. It later expanded to recognize all soldiers killed in battle, regardless of branch or allegiance. Memorial Day quickly spread throughout the United States. It developed into an unofficial holiday celebrated nationwide by 1890. It soon prompted Congress to pass legislation stating that Decoration Day should be formally recognized on May 30th each year. That date remained unchanged until 1968 when Congress officially changed Decoration Day's name to "Memorial Day." The Uniform Holiday Bill was created so Americans would not have their weekend holidays. This happens when the holiday falls too close to another legal holiday, like Labor Day or Washington's birthday. Finally, In 1971, President Nixon declared Memorial Day a federally-recognized holiday. It allowed federal employees three consecutive holidays off over Memorial weekend. And that became what we now know today as 'the long weekend' commonly associated with kicking off summer activities each spring.**

How Do We Celebrate Memorial Day?

Today, Memorial Day is a day to honor all who have died in American military service. It's a time for family and friends to come together and remember our heroes. We attend Memorial Day services and parades, place flags on gravesites, visit memorials, and observe moments of silence. Memorial Day is more than just an extra day off; it's a day of remembrance, gratitude, and appreciation for our country's fallen heroes. Today we honor those people with parades, speeches, laying wreaths at cemeteries or memorials, and flying flags at half-staff—all held throughout neighborhoods across America each Memorial Day Weekend. This federal holiday is an opportunity to participate in solemn ceremonies that pay tribute to our nation's heroes who gave their lives defending us from foreign or domestic enemies so that we may live free today. We encourage everyone to participate in Memorial Day traditions that pay tribute to our fallen heroes. Memorial Day is a time for reflection, honoring the brave men and women who have served our country. It's also great to get together with family or friends.

Ideas for Memorial Day Celebrations include:

- Visiting a Memorial Park or Cemetery to pay your respects and lay wreaths Attending Memorial Day parades in your local community
- Flying the American flag at half-staff to remember those who have served our country
- Making a donation to an organization that supports veterans
- Reflecting on our freedom and rights as Americans due to their courage and dedication
- Having a picnic with friends or family
- Taking part in Memorial Day ceremonies at your local community centers or churches

No matter how you choose to celebrate Memorial Day, it's important to remember why we do it. Memorial Day is more than just a three-day weekend. It's a day that recognizes and honors the brave individuals who have served our country and made the ultimate sacrifice.

What Not to Do on Memorial Day

Memorial Day is a day of <u>somber remembrance</u> and gratitude.

Saying "Happy Memorial Day" might be considered by many to be in poor taste, as it can make light of a day that honors those who died while serving in the military. If you had a loved one who died in the line of duty, "happy" isn't how you would likely describe Memorial Day. Don't Get It Mixed Up With Veterans' Day

Memorial Day is not the same as Veterans Day, which is celebrated each year and honors all veterans (living and dead) who have served in the US military. Memorial Day specifically honors those who died while serving in the military. There's nothing wrong with thanking a veteran for their service, but remember that this day is for remembering those who gave their lives defending our freedom.

Remembering Our Fallen Heroes

We hope you've found some valuable information about Memorial Day 2023 here. Memorial Day is important to remember those who fought for our safety and security, so take the time to honor their sacrifice.

Memorial Day is a day of remembrance dedicated to honoring those who have made the ultimate sacrifice for our freedom and security. We encourage everyone to take this time to remember our fallen heroes and honor their service.

Loyalty Day

Loyalty Day is observed annually on May 1st. In the United States, National Loyalty Day is a special holiday meant for the reaffirmation of loyalty to the United States of America, and for the recognition of the heritage of American freedom. Loyalty Day was made an official reoccurring holiday on July 18, 1958, although it was first recognized on May 1, 1955. Loyalty Day has been honored with an official proclamation every year, by every president, since its inception as a legal holiday in 1958.

When is Loyalty Day 2023?

Loyalty Day will be observed on Monday, May 1, 2023. Loyalty Day kicks off National Military Appreciation Month each year. Since 1958, each presidential proclamation has been vastly different, reflecting each president's own definition of loyalty, and with a unique emphasis in relation to the threats of the era. In his first Loyalty Day proclamation, President Dwight D. Eisenhower was quoted as saying that "the prime requisite for retaining our freedom is unswerving devotion to the liberties embodied in our Constitution." As Americans, we do not command loyalty, but seek to earn it through our actions — Including by living up to the principles enshrined in our Constitution and respecting the will of the people as reflected in the democratic process. – Joseph R. Biden Jr, President of the United States of America On Loyalty Day, we recognize and reaffirm our allegiance to the principles upon which our Nation is built. We pledge our dedication to the United States of America and honor its unique heritage, reminding ourselves that we are one Nation, under God, made possible by those who have sacrificed to defend our liberty. Military Spouse Appreciation Day

You don't need a specific Military Spouse Appreciation Day to make sure you acknowledge the military spouse in your life. Service members know that their spouses are the ones who keep the home fires burning. And military spouses know that those around them also walking through military life are more than just friends and neighbors: They are family.

You are the service members, family and friends of military spouses who stay up-to-date on military news, benefits, fitness, veteran jobs -- and you know family is what keeps military life moving forward.

What is Military Spouse Appreciation Day?

Military Spouse Appreciation Day is a day set aside for us to pause to recognize the military spouses around us who have the greatest impact on our lives and our military communities.

When is Military Spouse Appreciation Day?

The Friday in May before Mother's Day, this special day was first r ecognized by President Ronald Reagan in 1984. The sitting president typically issues a proclamation in recognition of the holiday, while celebrations are held on and near U.S. military bases around the world.

May is also host to a series of other military holidays, including <u>Military</u> <u>Appreciation Month</u>, established in 1999; Victory in Europe (VE) Day, commemorating the end of WWII in Europe on May 8, 1945; and Armed Forces Day, designated in 1949. <u>Memorial Day</u>, the only official federal holiday in May, is celebrated the last Monday of the month.

National Military Appreciation Month

May, marked officially as Military Appreciation Month, is a special month for both those in and out of the military.

Not only do we pause on <u>Memorial Day</u> to remember the sacrifice and service of those who gave all, but the month also holds several other military anniversaries and events, including <u>Military Spouse</u> <u>Appreciation Day</u> and <u>Armed Forces day</u>.

Join Military.com as we honor the service and sacrifice of members of the <u>Army</u>, <u>Navy</u>, <u>Air Force</u>, <u>Coast</u> <u>Guard</u>, <u>Marines</u>, <u>Space Force</u> and <u>National Guard</u> as well as the contribution of their <u>spouses</u>.

Congress designated May as National Military Appreciation Month in 1999 to ensure the nation was given the chance to publicly show their appreciation for troops past and present.

What is Military Appreciation Month

Each year the president makes a proclamation, reminding Americans of the important role the U.S. Armed Forces have played in the history and development of our country. May was chosen because it has many individual days marked to note our military's achievements, including Loyalty Day, established in 1921, Victory in Europe (VE) Day commemorating the end of WWII in Europe in 1945, Children of Fallen Patriots Day and the <u>anniversary of the death of Osama bin Laden</u>.

Military Appreciation Day

Many locations also celebrate a specific Military Appreciation Day. Although not a nationally recognized holiday, areas use the day to hold parties and picnics in honor of their local active duty, Guard, Reserve and military veteran communities. Local businesses may offer discounts, while local sports teams may give free entrance to military families and veterans.



Armed Forces Day

Among the many military holidays celebrated each year is Armed Forces Day. Celebrated the third Saturday in May, Armed Forces Day falls during <u>Military Appreciation Month</u> and joins <u>Memorial</u> <u>Day</u>, <u>Military Spouse Appreciation Day</u>, and Victory in Europe Day (V-E Day) as another May military-themed holiday.

The History of Armed Forces Day

On Aug. 31, 1949, Defense Secretary Louis Johnson announced the creation of an Armed Forces Day to replace separate <u>Army</u>, <u>Navy</u> and <u>Air Force</u> Days. The single-day celebration stemmed from the unification of the armed forces under one agency -- the Department of Defense.

In a speech announcing the creation of the day, President Truman "praised the work of the military services at home and across the seas." He said, "It is vital to the security of the nation and to the establishment of a desirable peace."

In an excerpt from the Presidential Proclamation of Feb. 27, 1950, Truman stated:

"Armed Forces Day, Saturday, May 20, 1950, marks the first combined demonstration by America's defense team of its progress, under the National Security Act, toward the goal of readiness for any eventuality. It is the first parade of preparedness by the unified forces of our land, sea, and air defense."

Armed Forces Day Themes


Each year, Armed Forces Day has a new theme. The very first theme was "Teamed for Defense."

Over the years, other themes have included Appreciation of a Nation; Arsenal of Freedom and Democracy; Dedication and Devotion; Deter if Possible, Fight if Necessary; Freedom; Freedom Through Unity; Guardians of Peace; Lasting Peace; Liberty; and Patriotism.

How to Celebrate Armed Forces Day

The first Armed Forces Day was celebrated by parades, open houses, receptions, and air shows. In Washington, D.C., 10,000 troops of all branches of the military, cadets and veterans marched past the president and his party. In Berlin, 1,000 U.S. troops paraded for the German citizens at Tempelhof Airfield. In New York City, an estimated 33,000 participants initiated Armed Forces Day "under an air cover of 250 military planes of all types."

PER NATIONAL: It is VERY IMPORTANT that the information about the Auxiliaries meetings, dues, address, city, state, zip, etc. to be entered and reviewed so that National Headquarters has UP-TO-DATE CONTACT INFORMATION at all times.

Note the **asterisk*** following the offices of President, Sr Vice President, Jr Vice President, Secretary, Treasurer and Trustees 3, 2 and 1 - Your Auxiliary will **NOT** be credited with a completed 2023-2024 INSTALLATION REPORT (pages 1 and 2) IF THESE EIGHT (8) OFFICES ARE <u>NOT</u> FILLED. National does ask that you do input the elected Chaplain, Conductress/Conductor and Guard which are listed on page 3 as they are officers

The President, Secretary and Treasurer can**not** serve as Trustees, See Section 801. It is necessary that the Installing Officer give their title as well as the date they signed the Installation Report on Page 3.

How Can We Help? There are nearly 3,500 Auxiliaries. If each Auxiliary were to donate \$3 in December, the National Home could finish 2022 having already met their goal!

Eligibility Requirements for VFW Auxiliary Membership:

Members must be at least 16 years old.

Those eligible are:

- Husband/Wife
- Widower/Widow
- Father/Mother
- Grandfathers/Grandmothers
- Sons/Daughters
- Grandsons/Granddaughters
- Brothers/Sisters

Of persons who were or are eligible for membership in the Veterans of Foreign Wars of the United States.

Those eligible for membership in the VFW are those that have received a campaign medal for overseas service; have served 30 consecutive or 60 non-consecutive days in Korea; or have ever received hostile fire or imminent danger pay.

Step- and adopted parents, children, siblings (and half-siblings), grandparents and grandchildren are considered the same as biological parents, children, siblings, grandparents and grandchildren and may join the VFW Auxiliary under their VFW-eligible veteran.

Proof of service is required for eligibility and must be obtained by the applicant.

Whereas Section 708- National Dues, Bullet reads as:

 National Dues shall be five dollars (\$5.00) per annum on each member, effective January 1, 2012, paid by ACH transaction to National Headquarters.

Whereas there has been no increase in the National Dues in more than a decade.

Whereas the cost of absolutely everything has escalated in the last several years.

Therefore, let it be resolved that Section 708- National Bylaws of the Veterans of Foreign Wars Auxiliary read as follows:

Sec. 708—National Dues shall be eight dollars commencing on July 1, 2024.

An increase of two dollars (\$2.00) per annum on each member for the 2025 Dues year, progressing each year thereafter in the amount of two dollars (\$2.00) until reaching a total of twenty dollars (\$20.00) National Dues per annum on each member in the year 2030.  - The term of office for which Delegates are elected shall be for one (1) year from date of the election, as described in this Section, until the election of the new Delegates.

All National Delegates and Alternates <u>MUST</u> be entered in MALTA by the Secretary no later May 31,2023. If you are an Auxiliary Secretary and cannot do this on your own, your Department Secretary can help you or you may mail your Delegates and Alternates list to National Headquarters. Mailed lists must be postmarked by 5/31/23.

If you are a member who was voted in at your Auxiliary meeting as a Delegate or Alternate and your Secretary does not enter your name as such in MALTA by 5/31/23, you will not have a vote at National Convention. Once your Secretary enters you as a Delegate or an Alternate, you will see the following on your MALTA log in pages:







Otherwise, your Delegates and Alternates will not be permitted to cast their votes, which means your members' voices will go unheard. The registration deadline closes May 31, 2023.
