Safety Tips for The Holidays

10 Ways to Stay Safe as You Deck the Halls this Holiday Season

The holiday season is here, and the American Red Cross wants everyone to stay safe from home fires as they decorate their homes for the upcoming festivities.

Decorations like trees, lights and candles increase the risk of home fires during the holidays—with Christmas, New Year's Eve and New Year's Day being the top three days for home candle fires, according to the National Fire Protection Association.

The Red Cross wants people to stay safe from home fires—the nation's most frequent disaster—by testing their smoke alarms and practicing their home fire escape plan with free resources at redcross.org/homefires. In addition, you can follow these 10 simple safety tips as you put up lights and ornaments:

- 1.all holiday light cords to make sure they aren't frayed or broken. Don't string too many strands of lights together—no more than three per extension cord.
- 2. are buying an artificial tree, look for the fire-resistant label. When putting it up, keep it away from fireplaces, radiators and other sources of heat.
- 3.getting a live tree, make sure it's fresh and water it to keep it fresh. Bend the needles up and down to make sure no needles fall off.
- 4.using older decorations, check their labels. Some older tinsel is lead-based. If using angel hair, wear gloves to avoid irritation. Avoid breathing in artificial snow.
- 5.decorating outside, make sure decorations are for outdoor use and fasten lights securely to your home or trees. If using hooks or nails outside, make sure they are insulated to avoid an electrocution or fire hazard.
- 6. using a ladder, be extra careful. Make sure to have good, stable placement and wear shoes that allow for good traction.
- 7.'t use electric lights on metallic trees.
- 8.'t forget to turn off all holiday lights when going to bed or leaving the house.
- 9.children, pets and decorations away from candles.
- 10. hanging stockings on the fireplace mantel, don't light the fireplace.

Getting Your Car Ready for Winter

<u>Lights</u> Check your headlights, brake lights, turn signals, emergency flashers and interior lights. Be sure to also check your trailer brake lights and turn signals, if necessary.

<u>Windshield Wipers</u> You can quickly go through a lot of windshield wiper fluid in a single snowstorm. Make sure your vehicle's reservoir is full of high-quality "winter" fluid with de-icer before winter weather hits. Make sure defrosters and all windshield wipers work and replace any worn blades. Consider installing heavy-duty winter wipers if you live in an area that gets a lot of snow and ice.

<u>Cooling System</u> Make sure you have enough coolant in your vehicle, and that it meets the manufacturer's specifications. See your vehicle owner's manual for recommendations. Check the cooling system for leaks, test the coolant, and drain or replace the old coolant.

You may also want to visit your mechanic for a tune-up and ask them to check for leaks, badly worn hoses, or other needed parts, repairs, and replacements.

Stock Your Vehicle Carry items in your vehicle to handle common winter driving-related tasks, and supplies you might need in an emergency, including:

- •a snow shovel, broom, and ice scraper;
- •abrasive material (sand or kitty litter), in case your vehicle gets stuck in the snow;
- •jumper cables, flashlight, and warning devices (flares and emergency markers);
- •blankets for protection from the cold; and
- a cell phone and charger, water, food, and any necessary medicine.

Gas Up or Plug It In Keep your gas tank close to full whenever possible.

For electric and hybrid-electric vehicles, decrease the drain on the battery. In general, lithium ion batteries have reduced energy at lower temperatures. Additionally, most all vehicle batteries will use battery power for self-heating in low temperatures. The battery drain due to heating can be minimized by keeping your electric vehicle as warm as possible during freezing temperatures. common way to do this: plug your vehicle in at night during the winter, keeping the battery temperature in its optimal ranges.

<u>Plan Your Route</u> Check your local weather and traffic reports before heading out. If your roads are not in good shape, consider postponing non-essential travel until the roads are cleared. If you do have to go out, make sure you are prepared in case you become delayed while traveling. If making a long road trip when winter weather is forecasted, consider leaving early or changing your departure to avoid being on the roads during the worst of the storm.

Familiarize yourself with directions and maps before you go—even if you use a GPS—and let others know your route and anticipated arrival time. On longer trips, plan enough time to stop to stretch, get something to eat, check your phone, and change drivers or rest if you feel drowsy.

Eligibility Requirements for VFW Auxiliary Membership:

Members must be at least 16 years old.

Those eligible are:

- Husband/Wife
- •Widower/Widow
- Father/Mother
- •Grandfathers/Grandmothers
- Sons/Daughters
- •Grandsons/Granddaughters
- Brothers/Sisters

Of persons who were or are eligible for membership in the Veterans of Foreign Wars of the United States.

Those eligible for membership in the VFW are those that have received a campaign medal for overseas service; have served 30 consecutive or 60 non-consecutive days in Korea; or have ever received hostile fire or imminent danger pay.

Step- and adopted parents, children, siblings (and half-siblings), grandparents and grandchildren are considered the same as biological parents, children, siblings, grandparents and grandchildren and may join the VFW Auxiliary under their VFW-eligible veteran.

Proof of service is required for eligibility and must be obtained by the applicant.

Today's events are tomorrow's history because every picture tells a story. Make this Program
Year the time to refresh your storytelling skills. Our job as the Historian is to capture the
Auxiliary year and share it with all our members and our communities through photos and
videos. According to Article VIII, Section 822 (722) of the Podium Edition's Bylaws and Ritual,
"The Historian shall collect all authentic material pertaining to the history of their Auxiliary,
carefully compile the same, and submit a report at the end of the year."

Let's begin to learn the art of communication through photos. Our Auxiliaries are well-worth preserving. If we band together to preserve our history while sharing it with new members, our organization will never become irrelevant. The work of your Auxiliaries is important! How does your Department preserve your Department history? Is this task left up to just one person within your Auxiliary or your Department? Where is the best place to maintain those paper and printed pictures for long term preservation? Have you considered looking at electronic record options that can also preserve our history for a long time? This is possibly a discussion to have within your Department. Photographs can open the door to the past as well as our future. The past will take your members back in time, but into the future due to the advancement in technology that changes for the better every day.

Share those stories/interviews of our longtime (Legacy) members. They can bring back the days of old. Consider utilizing your Auxiliary social media. Use it to promote the Auxiliary Programs. Use a newsletter to keep members informed. Get an article published in your local newspaper. Believe it or not, this does grab a non-member's attention toward what your Auxiliary is doing in your community. After your Auxiliary completes a Program project, take a moment to write down the story of your work. Who did you help? Why? What led you to reach out in this project? It is through stories that we stay connected. If you share those stories with others looking to serve, we can multiply our organization's capacity for preserving our Auxiliary memories.

Are you beginning to reclaim your Auxiliary history and heritage? Have you begun doing those video interviews? Many have shared how excited their Auxiliary members are about these interview videos. I am certainly happily amazed at the interest and excitement. However, I must also request that you get a photo release signed by the Auxiliary member whom you will be interviewing.

Remember to document every video interview from your Auxiliaries. The Department Historian & Media Relations Chairman should keep a total combined list of every Auxiliary in your

Department that completed a video interview and completed an entry form, which are available in MALTA Member Resources. The Department Historian & Media Relations Chairman will email their list to National Headquarters, info@vfwauxiliary.org, by April 30, 2024. National will issue a citation to the Auxiliary for their participation directly.

Since the video interview is a new concept this Program Year, many additional questions have been asked.

WHO SHOULD BE INTERVIEWED?

Any longtime member in your Auxiliary that has been extremely beneficial as a mentor and/or has a long history of aiding our veterans and their families. Ask them about the experiences. Be sure to ask them what being a member of the VFW Auxiliary family means to them. Be creative, use your imagination. Do a trial run, check the audio and the lighting. Be careful of unflattering shadows. Check the settings on your equipment, make sure it is set up properly before you begin. Be clear when you are speaking; don't talk too fast. Give your member time to answer fully and without interruption; make sure to engage with your member by keeping eye contact, smile and stay interested. This is their story! You are the film director!

HOW DO I RECORD AND SUBMIT THE VIDEO?:

You have several ways to record and submit your videos. The easiest way is to do the videos with your phone or tablet. Using your phone doesn't take a lot of experience. Phones are now designed to serve as multiple devices; just be familiar with your equipment. The audio on many smart phones has also become more advanced. You can also consider posting your videos on your Auxiliary social media pages (Facebook, etc). This would allow other members of your Department to see them, enjoy them and learn from them. Also, the use of your Department social media page not only publishes what you do, but gives even a small Auxiliary within your Department a significant voice. They sometimes feel "overlooked."

You should put the interviews on a thumb drive to share with me, but when sending these thumb drives to me, don't forget to also complete and send the National Historian Award #1 Form.

There are many different thumb drives available to purchase, including some that you can plug right into your phone.

Don't forget that the Department Historian & Media Relations Chairman is to capture photos of our National President during her Official Visit. Then, send a PowerPoint presentation to me with a minimum of five photos, and no more than, of her visit to your Department. Please be certain these photos are clear and tell a story. Submit it on a thumb drive to me by April 30, 2024. The PowerPoint from each Department will be combined into a single presentation and shown at the National Convention. A copy of the single presentation will be presented to National President Carla to keep.

I would also like to encourage your Auxiliaries to bring out those old Historian photo albums at one of your Auxiliary meetings. All the reminiscing will surprise you. There will be more laughs from your younger members and many starry eyes from your older members.

A final thought as this year moves forward ... Take those photos; Do those interviews. Let's continue preserving our heritage and history, one camera SAVE button at a time. Until later, Happy fall, y'all!

Entering a Meeting

- At a local Auxiliary meeting, you will enter the meeting room and once the doors are closed, all members must show a current dues card.
- At Department and National meetings, your card will be asked for at the door

Showing Proper Respect to the Flag

- During our Ritualistic meeting, the President will say "Salute" when the flags enter and leave the room, as well as when we say the Pledge of Allegiance and sing the national anthem. Salute the Flag by placing the palm of the right hand flat over the heart.
- During Auxiliary meetings, the heart salute shall be used at all times where the salute is used.
 - A member who is also a veteran may use the military salute.
- When the Flag is displayed AND the national anthem is played and/or sung, all present should face the Flag and salute.
- When the Flag is NOT displayed and the national anthem is played and/or sung, all present should face the music and salute.
 - Members should stand when the flags are moving.

Marine Corps Birthday - 10th November 1775

Veterans Day - November 11

Veterans Day is an opportunity to publicly commemorate the contributions of living veterans.

Originally called Armistice Day in 1926 through a congressional resolution. It became a national holiday 12 years later.

Congress decided to make the day an occasion to honor <u>all those</u> who have served America. In 1954, President Dwight D. Eisenhower signed a bill proclaiming November 11 as Veterans Day.

Pearl Harbor Day - December 7

On the morning of December 7, 1941, Japanese bombers staged a surprise attack on U.S. military forces in Hawaii. In a devastating defeat, the United States suffered 2,403 casualties and destruction or damage to nearly 20 American naval vessels, including eight battleships and more than 300 airplanes. Japanese losses were less than 100 personnel, 29 planes, and five midget submarines.

The day after the attack, before a joint session of Congress, President Franklin D. Roosevelt asked Congress for a declaration of war against Japan. President Roosevelt's message conveyed the national outrage over the Pearl Harbor attack by pronouncing December 7, 1941 "a date which will live in infamy."

FDR was furious at Japan's confidence in their "inevitable triumph" of the United States. On December 8, 1941, the United States declared war against Japan; on December 11, Germany and Italy declared war against the United States.

Today, the USS Arizona Memorial on the island of Oahu honors the lives lost on the day of the attack. Visitors to the memorial reach it via boats from the naval base at Pearl Harbor.



Did you know that the Ohio Veterans Home is celebrating it's 135th Birthday November 13 10:00 AM Sandusky Veterans Home Great Room

In 1886, a group of citizens led by I.F. Mack of Sandusky, successfully petitioned the State Legislature to establish a home for Ohio's honorably discharged Civil War veterans. These veterans, because of incapacitating disease, wounds, or other cause, were unable to earn a living. Governor J.B. Foraker appointed a commission charged with selecting a site and arranging for construction of the home.

This commission became the first Board of Trustees. Members I.F. Mack, Sandusky; P.I. Brown, Zanesville; W.P. Orr, Piqua; Thomas Dill, Mansfield; and Thomas Paxton, Cincinnati, met on June 3, 1886 and elected Mr. Mack chairman and Mr. Brown secretary.

A contract was entered into with the City of Sandusky deeding approximately 100 acres to the State. Construction was completed and on November 19, 1888, under the supervision of General Manning F. Force, the first 17 men were admitted to the Ohio Soldiers and Sailors Home. Since that day, more than 50,000 veterans have been admitted to residency.

- Sponsoring a youth group is taking another group and working with them on projects. These projects
 can support our Veterans and/or engage them in one of our programs.
- Working with a Youth Group is helping another youth group complete a community service activity
 that may be unrelated to our programs.

Want to earn extra points for your house? Here's how... complete one or more of these challenges by getting your youth involved!

Challenge #1

- Part B: Valentine's Day Cards for Veterans
 - O Have some of your youth create at least 10 homemade Valentines for the veterans at the Ohio Veterans Home and the veteran hospitals in Ohio. Some 4 x 6 inch cards, heart stickers, and various colors of paper hearts were given to the District Chairmen to get you started as well. Please send the cards to Misty by January 15th or give them to her at Midwinter, so that her class can create any additional ones needed to ensure each veteran receives a card.

Challenge #2: Involving our Youth with another Program Chairman

We need to involve our youth in as many aspects of the VFW Auxiliary programs as possible. Not only to teach them about Veterans but to help them learn to serve their communities. Be their role models and introduce them to others who will lead them on a positive path. Help them make the world a better place by showing them that they matter, and they can make a difference. Some examples of this might be asking the Student Council students to set up a voting registration booth for seniors who have turned 18 or having children pass out flags and/or poppies in a parade.

Challenge #3: Youth Mental Health Awareness

This is very near and dear to the hearts of Trish, Misty, and Shannon (our President). It is encouraging our members to promote and encourage Suicide Awareness as well as Mental Health in our youth. All three of us have personal experiences with this, so you can reach out to us if you need ideas. Some auxiliaries have already reported and will earn extra house points. Yay!

The auxiliaries do a wonderful job promoting this with veterans, but we want to challenge them to facilitate awareness in our youth as well. Misty sees it firsthand in her classroom and trauma has become a big issue in the schools, which can lead to mental health issues as well. COVID, school shootings, trafficking, and sexual abuse have resulted in additional anxiety and depressive conditions. We want to reach our youth before they feel like suicide is the only answer.

Be on the lookout for some resources on the VFW Dept. Ohio Auxiliary Chairmen Resources Facebook page to help you with this challenge and better prepare you for facilitating mental health awareness with our youth! Here is where Luna (Misty) comes back in... she is very forgetful in the movies and loses lots of things like her shoes and wand. The members at the School of Instruction were asked to help Luna find her shoes and wand, just as we want to help the veterans who are "lost" when they return home or the children in our schools and homes who need our help!

- If you send a hard copy report please send it to one of the Youth Co-Chairmen ONLY. Do NOT send it
 to both of us please.
- If you enter information on the new reporting website, please do NOT send us a hard copy.
- Please make sure you fill out all of the information on the report form including the auxiliary, district, number of miles, number of hours, dollars spent, and a description of your activity.
- When you give copies of reports to the district reps during official visits, please write already sent or some indication that the report has already been sent or put online. This will ensure that they do not duplicate ones you have already reported.
- In order to receive credit for an activity in the Youth Program, you must have already completed the
 activity.
- If you make a donation, the report CANNOT be approved until the Department has received the money and notified us.
- Voice of Democracy, Patriot's Pen, and Young American Creative Art donations go to Scholarship, not the Youth Program.

AUXILIARY COMMUNITY OUTREACH

First of all, let me thank you for all the reports. I love reading what everyone is doing in their Auxiliary. Please read what qualifies for the Auxiliary Community Outreach. I am getting so many reports that do not qualify. We all work hard for our Auxiliaries and I wish I could count everyone's reports. This program is confusing to so many. My best effort to explain it is a quote "people helping People" we have to help another organization with their project it cannot be another VFW. It also cannot be donations of money or items! This is donating time and energy to help another non-profit organization succeed in their project. It must be voted across the Auxiliary floor, which must be recorded in your minutes, you have to represent the auxiliary by wearing an auxiliary shirt.. All organizations are struggling to get volunteers. This is a good way to show the community that our organization is not just serving the Post that we care enough to help with others. I am also challenging everyone in the Department of Ohio Auxiliary to write an essay on what you did to promote this project, how did it make you feel, and what does auxiliary outreach mean to you. My award this year will be this on our Facebook page at the end of the year to give others ideas on what they can to do for Auxiliary Community Outreach in the future.

What's considered Auxiliary Outreach

When an entire Auxiliary volunteer for an organization outside of their own, if the project was approved by the Auxiliary and recorded in the meeting minutes prior to the project.

Examples include:

- Participation in walks that benefit other organizations as an event spotter, water station volunteer, timekeeper, etc. (walking or running in the race is not part of Auxiliary Outreach.)
- Working with local police on child ID kits.
- Working with firefighters on fire safety and prevention.
- Working with EMTs to host CPR training.
- Working with parks and recreation departments to plant trees, adopt-a-park initiatives and develop community art installations.
- Volunteering at an animal shelter.
- Serving food at soup kitchens.
- Delivering food for Meals on Wheels.

What's Not Considered Auxiliary Outreach

- Auxiliary Outreach is for projects NOT AFFLILIATED with VFW or VFW Auxiliary Programs.
- Volunteer work that is performed for the benefit of the Post or Auxiliary is NOT considered outreach service. Examples of projects that do not qualify include:
- Repairs or maintenance of the Post Home,
- · Cooking or serving a meal for a Post or Auxiliary Fundraiser.

- "Buddy" Poppy distribution.
- VFW or Auxiliary meetings, Conventions, Conferences or School of instruction.
- Church activities for one specific congregation and not the entire community (e.g., usher, elder, deacon, minister, etc.

What Does Qualify VS. Does Not Qualify as Auxiliary Outreach

QUALIFIES	DOES NOT QUALIFY
Spending time in a local homeless shelter kitchen serving meals, bussing tables or cleaning up.	Taking comfort items to the local USO.
Working with the police or fire department on bicycle or home safety training class.	Donating trophies to a youth sports group. Hosting a luncheon/dinner for a local community club.
Your auxiliary approves helping a local cancer group setting up their event or manning a booth.	Sending an Auxiliary check to support a charity that organized a walk-a-thon or run.
Volunteering with the garden club to clean up local parks.	Collecting clothing and comfort items for homeless veterans at the Post Home. (This would be Veterans & Family Support.)
Help a youth group collect food donations for local pantry.	Passing the collection basket at church services.

I got the last information off the National Ambassador's information a lot is directly typed the same to explain this to everyone better. Please keep sending in your reports and make sure you are doing what needs to be done for the projects to count. Please don't hesitate to call me with questions. I am here to help mentor and guide you. I'd rather you call and ask if it qualifies if you are uncertain then to snail mail the project and it be rejected, I don't want you to waste money on stamps.

The time is now to find out why they let their membership lapse. Is if there's any thing you can do to get them to return to our organization.

If any member has a question, comment or concern for the National Headquarters please get with me and I can take the information and pass onto them.


I will be heading to the National Mid-Winter and get more information to share with all.
