The life membership is coming in strong, which tells me that our newest members are finding homes in their auxiliary at the post. Please don't forget to reach out by contacting members that have not paid they could be sick or facing common everyday hardships that many people struggle with daily. We can't forget that Kindness Counts, a Smile is infectious, and sometimes a simple phone call can go a long way. I know that sometimes we find ourselves at odds with one another and I know that not everyone will like one another, but we have to come together, leaving the drama at the door and doing what is best for our Veterans, Communities and Posts. You all are very special human beings or you wouldn't want to be a part of something as special as a volunteer family and touching lives in our communities, while doing the right thing and following the National by-laws for your Auxiliary.

I want to go over a few reminders for all of you for your Auxiliary.

 Delegates: Delegates are due May 31<sup>st</sup> to the Department Secretary Diana Morris and mailed back to the Department Office or emailed to <u>treasurer@vfwauxoh.org</u>. Page 33, Section 303, A, Department Meetings and Conventions, gives the auxiliary the right to vote to send one delegate and one alternate for each 30 members to Department convention. This is to be sent in by the Auxiliary Secretary. Secretaries, while you are doing your Department delegates log into your Malta account and enter your National Delegates.

- Applications: Please take your time when filling out Auxiliary applications by making sure every required field is filled out and completed, especially the birthdate and your Auxiliary number. "REMEMBER DUES DO NOT GO UP UNTIL JULY 1<sup>st</sup>!" Dues sent to Department until July 1, 2024 is \$9.50 per annual member, and the full amount according to birthdate for a life member. Credit Card applications have to go to National if there is a problem or the application has not been sent in a timely manner it could cause problems on credit cards being declined.
- Office Hours: Our office staff is not physically in the office but once a week, however the phones are answered by our Department Secretary Diana who works from home. Remember, all of our staff per our budget is part-time as well as elected/appointed staff that also volunteer many hours to our organization, so I ask that you show them the same amount of respect and kindness that you would want to be treated with.
- Department Convention: The information for Kalahari is out and, on the website, along with the Auxiliary tentative agenda. The only rooms available are for Friday, June 7<sup>th</sup> and Saturday June 8<sup>th</sup>, double queens. If you have

any questions you can call the VFW Department of Ohio Headquarters as they handle all reservations for Kalahari.

- Election of Officers: Our National Auxiliary By-laws state under Sec. 804B-Auxiliary, A. Elective Officers shall be nominated and elected at a REGULAR business meeting in April. Please make sure that you elect your officers this month and remember how instrumental our auxiliaries are in keeping the magic spreading for our Heroes, Communities and Posts. With every member that belongs to our organization is a voice that carries to Washington D.C. and is vital to assist in getting legislation passed for the very reason we joined the VFW Auxiliary and that is your Veteran.
- Audits: Make sure that you are going to the Dashboard and checking to make sure you have your audits turned in and if not please get the Audit in ASAP. Treasurers you are financially responsible for the Auxiliary treasury. Remember, you are running a very small business with your friends and family's monies. Please, make sure that you have every cent that you have spent accounted for by keeping all receipts and making them available to your trustees at meetings and at the audits. Secretaries, the minutes must contain when there is any money spent in your auxiliary, someone making the motion, getting a second, any discussion and if the motion passed or failed. If the minutes and the treasurers report does not match this can be a red flag for your District President when coming in for your official visit in the future.

 Reporting: We are almost there 100% reported in every program. I know you can do this, I believe that we can do anything together and being 100% reported in every program shows the IRS and Congress the hours and mileage that we as an organization are out in our communities doing for our veterans and how much magic we spread. We show them that "Together We Can Do Anything".

Please stay good to one another, work the programs for our Veterans, and believe in the mission. If we believe, Together, we will Rise.

# April Is Military Child Month

April is the month that marks the start of warmer Spring weather. It is also a month with <u>a</u> <u>lot of holidays and observances.</u> You might think of April Fools Day and Easter Day. But did you know that the month as a whole also celebrates? April is the month of the military child! Its history, meaning, range of activities and events are all worth knowing. So, we have covered everything in this article. Make sure you read until the very end!

# 1. What is the month of the military child?

It is meant to express appreciation for children who have military parents (no matter one or both) as they go through unique challenges and in a way, make sacrifices: they may not receive full and consistent care, be forced to move homes and change schools frequently, separate from friends and family members all the time, etc.

So, by the same token, the month of the military child recognizes the large role that children of military parents play in the Armed Forces' success. Aside from honoring military children, April raises awareness and assists children in their time of need by providing funds and other resources.

# 2. History

The month of the military child was established in 1986 by Caspar Weinberger, a Defense Secretary. Since then, April has been considered as the military kid month by the Department of Defense and celebrated by all military branches.

Every year, the President gives a proclamation about the month of the military child.

 There are over 1.6 million military children with many unique challenges due to their parent's or parents' service.

### Purple Up Month of the Military Child

The key event for the month of the military child is the national Purple Up day. It is on April 15 and is a military child appreciation day. In essence, to thank and show your support, you would wear purple for military children across the nation. Americans everywhere are encouraged to do this. **But why purple for military children appreciation?**  The idea is that purple represents all the branches of the military: the Army's green, Marine Corps's red, Air Force's blue, Navy's blue, and Coast Guard's blue combined together makes purple.

#### Eligibility Requirements for VFW Auxiliary Membership:

Members must be at least 16 years old.

Those eligible are:

- •Husband/Wife
- •Widower/Widow
- •Father/Mother
- •Grandfathers/Grandmothers
- Sons/Daughters
- •Grandsons/Granddaughters
- Brothers/Sisters

Of persons who were or are eligible for membership in the Veterans of Foreign Wars of the United States.

Those eligible for membership in the VFW are those that have received a campaign medal for overseas service; have served 30 consecutive or 60 non-consecutive days in Korea; or have ever received hostile fire or imminent danger pay.

Step- and adopted parents, children, siblings (and half-siblings), grandparents and grandchildren are considered the same as biological parents, children, siblings, grandparents and grandchildren and may join the VFW Auxiliary under their VFW-eligible veteran.

Proof of service is required for eligibility and must be obtained by the applicant.




# Everything You Need to Know About R.E.D. Friday

(RED is an acronym that means Remember Everyone Devloyed)

What is RED Friday? For service members who are deployed, the act itself, civilians wearing red items of clothIt's a tiny act that means much more than people seem to realize. 

# So many of us continue to struggle for years, for decades, for a lifetime

Forty of my 42 years as a clinical psychologist were spent in uniform. The US Army got the very best of me over the course of four deployments in time of war. Given the opportunity, I would do it all over again.

As a survivor of the 2009 Fort Hood Massacre, I live with tremendous survivor guilt, but have found a cure. I have been very blessed by the opportunity

to provide services to 40 police departments and seven fire departments. I do this seven days a week. This work has become my reason for being.

I hold my breath through the holidays, even 13 years after the fact, desperately hoping they will pass without the aftermath of war's anguish gnawing at my soul. Relief remains elusive, even past the dawn of the new year. There were no stockings to be hung, no fireplace upon which to hang them. There were no gifts to be given, let alone any hope of a tree, living in lands many worlds away from our loved ones. What dropped out of the sky on New Year's Eve were mortars, rockets, and RPG's. The bleakness of cold desert saturated the soul, choking the life out of any hope for an inkling of joy or hope for anything, except more of the same. Unforgiving was the scent of moldy tents that housed dozens of us thrust together as a makeshift family. Family photos of loved ones at that moment that I realized that the universe had beduct-taped to tent walls offered little solace.

But we were there to join the struggle to make the world a better place for freedom to flourish.

Some of my most memorable holidays were spent in foreign lands, fraught with far deeper meaning than ever expected. We arrived in Iraq shortly before Christmas of 2004. It was decided that our company would gather at the chow hall for Christmas dinner together, as if the war stopped for any holiday, awash with great anticipation of a meal that might offer some turkey shipped from the States. By the time we were granted entry to the "dining facility", the chow hall had run out of food. It was to be another night of MRE's, fondly referred to as "meals refusing to exit," and maybe a few pieces of leftover lettuce to make them more festive. We were beyond demoralized. It was a tap on my shoulder that changed the entire course of the evening.

A young soldier grabbed me and threw me right out in the middle of the chow hall floor and began to lead me

in the foxtrot of the century, to the delight of hordes of Soldiers, many of whom were spending their first Christmas in the combat theater. Though only momentarily, we completely forgot the surrounding wretchedness and the fear and terror of things to come.

It was that very New Year's Eve where several of us gathered at the chow hall before we all separated and moved out to our respective Forward Operating Bases throughout Iraq. We would not reconvene for another 11 months, knowing full well that we might never see one another ever again. The War in Iraq was raging. It dawned on me that these really were the best of times. I was encircled by soldiers that I had come to love as brothers and sisters. We were bound together for all time by the mission to save souls, the one chance in life to engage in something far greater than ourselves. It was stowed an enormous gift upon me. I wanted to be nowhere else and with no one else at that time. This was the pinnacle of all things purpose-driven. We had each chosen this pathway and some kind of perverse fate had thrown us into this toxic soup together. It's what we were destined to do. It would be a moral failing to overlook the lessons in this and the brief seconds of joy that drove this revelation home.

Maybe someday I'll catch my breath again.

In honor of Mental Health Month, please take the time to reach out to a Veteran, a police officer, a firefighter/ paramedic, or a dispatcher. Give more than a simple acknowledgement of their service and sacrifices. So many of us continue to struggle for years, for decades, for a lifetime. Let us know that what we have offered up to the banquet table of military and community service has more than just rote meaning.

# MORE FEMALE RECRUITS WILL HEAD TO SAN DIEGO

as Marines shutter historic Parris Island battalion

The Marine Corps is deactivating its formerly womenonly recruit battalion at Parris Island and will train more female Marines in San Diego, moves that come a year after the service completed a shift toward genderintegrated recruit companies.

The 4th Recruit Training Battalion at the Marine Corps Recruit Depot in South Carolina will close next month, the service said in a statement Wednesday.

The battalion was established in 1986 and was one of several all-female training units that existed at Parris Island from 1949 until recent years, when it opened to men. Marine Corps Commandant Gen. David Berger described the disbanding of the battalion as "a moment to celebrate progress."

"I'm proud to see our male and female recruits benefit from having access to the quality of all our leaders ... through an unchanging, tough and realistic recruit training curriculum," Berger said in the statement.

All female Marine Corps recruits were trained at Parris Island until last year, when women began arriving for training at the service's West Coast depot in San Diego. Female recruits are expected to be split evenly between the two locations by next year, the Marine Corps statement said.

The Corps is the service with the highest percentage of men in the military. Fewer than 10% of active-duty Marines are women, according to the most recent Defense Department figures. The service was the last to train men and women separately.

# Creating a safe space for women Veterans at VA

MST refers to sexual assault or sexual harassment experienced during military service. As with other forms of trauma, MST can impact women Veterans in different ways. VA provides free MST related mental health counseling and medical care at all VA medical centers and community-based outpatient clinics.

#### Wherever women Veterans receive care at VA, they should feel safe

VA also offers the **Beyond MST Mobile App**, a free, secure and private self-help mobile app created specifically to support the health and well-being of those who have experienced MST. Telehealth appointments are always an option for those not comfortable with in-person appointments.

IPV is a specific type of domestic violence that refers to physical, verbal, emotional and sexual abuse, as well as stalking, between intimate partners. Military service has unique psychological, social and environmental factors that contribute to elevated risk of IPV.

In response, VA created the VA Intimate Partner Violence Assistance Program (IPVAP), which offers guidance for healthier relationships between Veterans and their partners who may be experiencing IPV. The program provides confidential help through a local IPV coordinator who can offer safety planning guides and link women Veterans with VA providers. They also provide access to community-based support, domestic violence shelters, legal ser-Office if needed.

VA is committed to providing women Veterans with appropriate treatment and resources for their mental health needs. Wherever women Veterans receive care within VA, they should feel safe, confident and empowered during medical examinations. This fosters a safe environment, ensuring they receive the highest quality care possible.

About <u>1 in 3</u> women Veterans tell their VA health care provider they experienced sexual harassment or sexual assault while in the military.

It is important to note that sexual harassment and sexual assault can happen to anyone regardless of gender. Both men and women can experience sexual violence.

#### How is VA creating a safe and inclusive environment for women Veterans?

VA has a zero-tolerance policy for sexual assault and sexual harassment, which means VA expects and actively works to create a culture free of such incidents.
